

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I GENERAL SAFETY RULES

WARNING: When using this appliance, always exercise basic safety precautions, including the following:


- 1) Read all of the instructions before using this appliance.
- 2)Use this appliance only for its intended purpose as described in this user manual.
- 3)This Wine Cooler must be properly installed in accordance with the installation instructions before it is used. See grounding instructions in the installation section.
- 4) Never unplug your Wine Cooler by pulling on the power cord. Always grasp the plug firmly and pull it straight out from the outlet.
- 5) Repair or replace immediately all electrical cords that have become frayed or otherwise damaged. Do not use a cord that shows cracks or abrasion damage along its length, on the plug, or at the connector end.
- 6) Unplug your Wine Cooler before cleaning or repairing it. Note: If for any reason this product requires service, we strongly recommend that a certified technician perform the service.
- 7) If your Wine Cooler is not being used for a length of time or is being stored, we recommend that you remove the doors and leave the shelves in place. This will reduce the risk of danger to children.
- 8) This Wine Cooler should not be recessed or built into an enclosed cabinet. It is designed for freestanding installation only.
- 9) Do not operate your Wine Cooler in the presence of explosive fumes.
- 10) Your Wine Cooler was NOT designed to store perishable foods. Store only bottled or canned beverages.

SAVE THESE INSTRUCTIONS



Risk of child entrapment. Before you throw away your appliance, take off the doors. Leave the shelves in place so that children may not easily climb inside.

I INSTALLING YOUR WINE COOLER



Before plugging in your Wine Cooler, allow it at least 4 hours tostand upright for the refrigerant fluid to settle.

Unpacking Your Wine Cooler

1.Remove all packing material. This includes the foam base and all adhesive tape holding the Wine Cooler accessories inside and outside.

2.Inspect and remove any remaining packing material, tape, or printed materials before powering on the Wine Cooler.

Leveling Your Wine Cooler

·Your Wine Cooler has two leveling legs located at the front corners. After properly placing your Wine Cooler in its final position, you can level your Wine Cooler.

·Turn the leveling legs clockwise to lower your Wine Cooler or counterclockwise to raise your Wine Cooler. The Wine Cooler door will close more easily when the two front leveling legs are extended slightly.

Proper Air Circulation

·To ensure that your Wine Cooler works at maximum efficiency, install it in a location with proper air circulation and electrical connections.

•The following are recommended clearances around the Wine Cooler:

Sides 2" (50 mm) Top 2" (50 mm) Back 2" (50 mm)

•To achieve proper cooling, do not overfill your Wine Cooler.

Note: If your Wine Cooler has been tilted for any reason, wait 24 hours before plugging it in.

Drip Tray

·Ensure the drip tray in the rear of the unit is in the proper position.

Electrical Requirements

·Make sure there is a suitable power outlet (115V/15A) with proper grounding to power the Wine Cooler.

•Never use an adapter or cut off the grounding prong in order to accommodate a two-prong outlet. This is a dangerous practice since it provides no effective grounding for the Wine Cooler and may result in shock.

Installation Limitations

•Do not install your Wine Cooler in any location not properly insulated or heated (e.g., a garage). Your Wine Cooler was not designed to operate in ambient temperatures below 55° F.

•Select a suitable location for the Wine Cooler on a hard, even surface away from direct sunlight or heat sources (e.g., radiators, baseboard heaters, cooking appliances, etc.). Any floor unevenness should be corrected with the leveling legs located on the front bottom corners of the Wine Cooler.

·Your Wine Cooler is designed for freestanding installation only. It is not designed for built-in applications. Note: This unit is for indoor use only.

Use of Extension Cord

•The use of an extension cord poses a safety hazard under certain conditions. If it is necessary to use an extension cord, use only a 3-wire extension cord that has a 3-prong grounding plug in a 3-slot outlet that will accept the plug. The marked rating of the extension cord must be equal to or greater than the electrical rating of the appliance.

I INSTALLING YOUR WINE COOLER

Using Your Wine Cooler

Startup

Connect the power cord to a standard wall outlet. Do not use a GFCI outlet to connect the unit (see page 4). After connection, you will immediately hear a short beep.

Temperature - Adjustable Thermostat Control

The default temperature is 43°F. Use the \bigcirc and \bigcirc buttons to set the desired temperature between the range of 40°F - 61°F.

The display will flash while the temperature is being set. After a few seconds, it will revert to its current internal temperature reading. The digital display reading will adjust as the unit cools. While the unit is adjusting to the new setting, press the for buttons to view the selected temperature setting.

If there is a power outage, the unit will revert to the last temperature setting once power is restored.

Loading Beverages

When first loading the beverage center to full capacity, we recommend the following steps to effectively cool a large number of beverages.

- Use the Adjustable Thermostat Control to set the temperature to 43°F (also the default temperature).
- 2. Allow the beverage center to cool for a minimum of two hours.
- 3. Load the beverages. To achieve maximum capacity, refer to the loading diagrams.
- 4. After initially filling with beverages, the internal temperature will rise as indicated on the display.
- 5. Once the beverage center has cooled the beverages to 43°F, use the Adjustable Thermostat Control to select a desired cooler internal temperature (lowest temperature setting is 40°F).
- Allow several hours for the beverage center to cool to the desired lower temperature.

Note: It is normal for temperature variances to occur inside the unit, and areas near the door will have slightly warmer temperatures.

Shelving

To remove or replace a full-width slide-out shelf:

- 1.Gently tilt the shelf up and slide it forward until the shelf has been completely removed.
- 2.To replace the shelf, gently slide the shelf back into its original place.

Normal Operating Sounds You May Hear

- •Bubbling or gurgling sounds, or slight vibrations are the result of the refrigerant circulating through the cooling coils.
- ·The compressor makes sounds when cycling on and off.

I PROPER WINE COOLER CARE & CLEANING

Cleaning and Maintenance

Warning: To avoid electric shock, always unplug your Wine Cooler before

cleaning it. Ignoring this warning may result in severe injury.

Caution: Before using cleaning products, always read and follow manufac-

turer's instructions and warnings to prevent personal injury or

product damage.

General: • Prepare a cleaning solution of 3–4 T. of baking soda in warm water. Dampen a sponge or soft cloth with the cleaning solution

and use it to wipe your Wine Cooler.

Rinse with clean, warm water and dry with a soft cloth.

•Do not use harsh chemicals, abrasives, ammonia, chlorine bleach, concentrated detergents, solvents, or metal scouring pads. Some of these substances may erode, damage, and/or discolor your

Wine Cooler.

Door Gaskets: · Clean door gaskets every 3 months according to general

instructions. Gaskets must be kept clean and pliable to assure a

proper seal.

·Petroleum jelly applied lightly on the hinge side of gaskets will

keep the gasket pliable and ensure a good seal.

Defrosting Your Wine Cooler

Your Wine Cooler is designed with a manual defrost system. The Wine Cooler surfaces will defrost when the unit is unplugged. Water from the unit will be channeled onto a drip tray located on the compressor. Heat transfer from the compressor causes the water to evaporate.

Power Interruptions

•Occasional power interruptions may result from thunderstorms or other causes. Remove the power cord from the AC outlet when a power outage occurs. When power has been restored, reconnect the power cord to the AC outlet.

• The unit will revert to the factory setfing of 46°F after any power outage.Reset your temperature selection.

Vacation and Moving Care

•For long vacations or absences, empty contents from Wine Cooler, unplug the unit, and clean the Wine Cooler and door gaskets according to the section on general cleaning. Keep doors open so air can circulate inside. When moving the Wine Cooler, always keep the unit vertical. Laying the unit down could cause damage to the sealed system.

I TROUBLESHOOTING

Control Penel does not respond

·Check if control panel



is on.

Wine Cooler does not operate

- ·Check if Wine Cooler is plugged in.
- ·Check if there is power at the AC outlet by checking the circuit breaker.
- Check if the power pad is on.

Temperature is too warm

- Open the door less frequently.
- ·Allow time for recently added beverages to reach the proper temperature.
- Check door gaskets for proper seal.
- ·Adjust the temperature control to a lower setting.

Temperature is too cold

·Adjust the temperature control to a higher setting and allow several hours for temperature to adjust.

Wine Cooler runs too frequently

- ·In high temperatures and high humidity, it may be normal for the Wine Cooler to run continually to maintain a constant temperature.
- Open the door less frequently.
- ·Check door gaskets for proper seal.
- ·Check to see if doors are completely closed.

Moisture build-up on interior or exterior of the Wine Cooler

- ·This is normal in high humidity.
- Open the door less frequently.
- ·Check door gaskets for proper seal.

Wine Cooler door does not shut properly

- I evel the Wine Cooler.
- Check for blockages.

WARRANTY

We offers a limited 1-year warranty ("warranty period") on all of our products purchased new and unused from us with an original proof of purchase and where a defect has arisen, wholly or substantially, as a result of faulty manufacture, parts, or workmanship during the warranty period.
